2. Short description of the tool

Verbix is an online conjugation tool. It allows you to conjugate a verb in all tenses and several languages. **Verbix** is a conjugator that provides you with all the details the verb submitted (conjugation in all tenses, verbs conjugated alike, translation, synonyms and antonyms, etymology, sample sentences and additional information). On the website, there is also a verb finding tool that helps you identify a verb, its language, its conjugated form.

Verbix has several other functions.

- You can translate verbs into several languages and have access to their synonyms and antonyms.
- A list of cognates in several languages is available.
- You can also use **Verbix** to search for a verb form and a verb infinitive (verb finder).
- Educational games are available on the website to work on verbal forms in French, Portuguese and Spanish. Spanish and German language teachers can create their own word jumble.
- Language maps of the world are available. They are showing the different places where languages are spoken.

To access this tool, you do not need to create an account or register. It is a free access tool via its website. An application is available for Windows and also on smartphones (Android and IOS).



8. How can the tool be used by teachers/learners?
